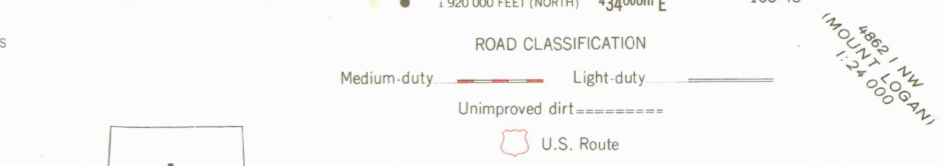
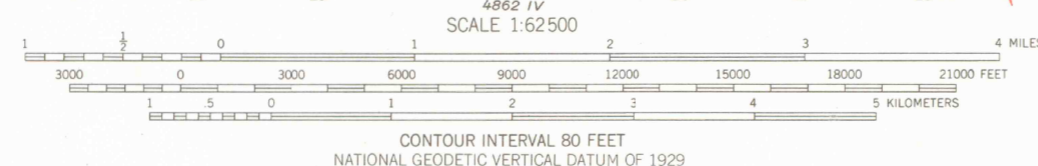
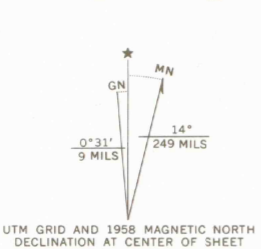

Topography from aerial photographs by photogrammetric methods. Aerial photographs taken 1953. Polyconic projection. 1927 North American Datum. 10,000-foot grid based on Colorado coordinate system, central and north zones 1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 13, shown in blue. Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations. Land lines unsurveyed in T.4S.-R.75W. except Sec. 22. Land lines omitted in T.4S.-Rs. 76 and 77W., T.6S.-R.75W., and in parts of T.5S.-Rs. 75, 76, and 77W., and T.6S.-R.76W. because of insufficient data. All recovered corners are shown.



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To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 5 meters north and 50 meters east.
